
Frisco Family Services' Volunteer Appreciation Celebration!



David's Story

David and his wife Susan had a great life, raising their two children and being a part of the Frisco community. David's job provided enough to support their family, and Susan stayed at home with the kids.

Then tragically, Susan was diagnosed with a terminal illness and quickly passed away. The kids were having a really tough time without their mom, and David's job kept him away too much for him to provide them the comfort and support they needed. It was clear that he had to find other employment so he could be home more with the kids. When he was able to find a new position, it required him to take a significant pay cut with no benefits and he soon was unable to make ends meet.

It was hard for David to explain to his kids why he was not eating every night at dinnertime, and that he was afraid of losing the house - the only home his kids ever knew. David never thought he would be in this situation. He had to come to the realization that he needed help, so he finally reached out to Frisco Family Services.

David was given the resources and guidance he needed to find a new job that provided enough income so they could stay in their home, pay the bills and afford limited child care. Through connections given to them to a local counseling center, the family was able to feel happy and healthy again.
