Dear Friends,

Impact is defined as having a *direct effect,* but this textbook definition doesn't quite capture the life changing impact you have made over the past year.

I am humbled by you and let me tell you why.

With or without a pandemic, a life-altering crisis such as a job loss, a critical injury or medical diagnosis, the passing of a loved one, or a divorce can happen to any one of us.

Inflation has pushed the combined cost of utilities, housing, and food - basic needs - upward by 9.2% when compared to last year. While inflation impacts us all, it doesn't impact us all the same. It not only compounds a crisis, it can also extend it beyond what our neighbors, including seniors on a fixed income, can absorb within their existing resources.

Frisco is often listed among the wealthiest cities in the nation. It is why some are surprised when learning what we see every day - crisis exists here. It's reflected in how more than 8,600 (or 13%) Frisco ISD students qualify for free or reduced-price meals. Even more so, it is reflected in the 25% increase in the number of people needing our assistance.

It is because of your support that we're able to help our neighbors stay in their homes, keep food on the table, prevent their utilities from being disconnected, and purchase life-saving medications and more.

This is the kind of IMPACT that changes lives.

For this, I am humbled and so thankful for your continued commitment to our community.

- assisting more than **4,100 individuals**, our neighbors, in crisis.
- providing almost **730,000 meals** through the Frisco Family Services Market.
 - providing more than \$1.9 million in annual program support.

PREVENTING HUNGER IN OUR COMMUNITY

Frisco Family Services Market

Clients shop at no cost in a grocery store-like setting for the food they know their family will eat, enabling them to use their limited financial resources for other essential needs. In addition to nutritious food choices – including meat, dairy, and fresh produce – hygiene and household products are also available.

Market Express

Market Express is an online shopping alternative for those who do not feel comfortable with in-person shopping, or have limited availability due to their work schedule.

Mobile Market

For our seniors and other individuals who are unable to drive, lack transportation, or are suffering from an illness, the Mobile Market provides home delivery. It is just another way we work to ensure our clients have access to the same nutritious food that is available at our Market location.





Summer Lunch Program

Our Summer Lunch Program provides lunch daily and weekend meals throughout the summer to local children typically eligible for free and reduced-price lunch during the school year. Children also participate in recreational activities, social time and meeting new friends. On Fridays, nutritious produce boxes are distributed.



Thanksgiving Meal Program

Our Thanksgiving Meal Program provides individuals and families with a turkey, and everything needed to prepare a traditional Thanksgiving meal in the comfort of their own home. A game or movie is also included to encourage quality family time together.

PREVENTING HOMELESSNESS IN OUR COMMUNITY

Emergency Financial Assistance

We help families stay in their homes, keep utilities connected, purchase prescription medication, and assist with other critical needs. Payments are made to utility providers, landlords and other entities on behalf of clients. To apply for emergency financial assistance, a prospective client must live within the city of Frisco or within Frisco ISD.

PROVIDING OPPORTUNITIES AND STABILITY

Challenging Adult Minds for Personal Success (CHAMPS)

CHAMPS workshops are facilitated by local businesses and professional volunteers in the community who provide each client with tools, training, skills and support necessary to achieve or maintain self-sufficiency and success.

Intensive Self-Sufficiency Program (ISSP)

ISSP provides critical support to clients who have limited education and employment experience. Through one-on-one intensive case management, an individualized plan of action is developed that allows the client to remove barriers and obtain their financial independence once again.

Seasonal Programs

Throughout the year, Frisco Family Services' seasonal programs provide support and a sense of normalcy to individuals and families. Seasonal programs are made possible through generous financial contributions, in-kind donations, and invaluable volunteers who want to make a difference in our community.







Back2School Fun Fair

Eligible Frisco and Frisco ISD students, grades K-12, receive a new backpack filled with school supplies, new clothing and shoes, hygiene items, haircuts, vision screenings, glasses, and more to ensure they are ready for the new school year. Parents and caregivers are provided with helpful community resources.

Holiday Store Program

To help ensure individuals and families have a joyous holiday season during a time of crisis, generous donors provide toys, bicycles, shoes, gift cards, new clothing, and household items for eligible clients to select at our "no-cost" holiday store.

Silver Bells Holiday Social & Celebration

This special event spreads joy to eligible senior clients who join together for a delicious meal, socialize, play games, and receive holiday gifts.

Armed with a relocation package, savings,

and determination, Marquise and his family set down new roots in Frisco. Imagine the wave of uncertainty that overcame him when the firm unexpectedly eliminated the position and now he and his wife were unemployed.

While seeking work, he began cutting hair to supplement their limited income. Following up on a tip, he contacted Frisco Family Services for assistance. With guidance from his Case Manager, they were able to keep food on the table, the lights on, and regain a sense of normalcy.

On this journey toward regaining self-sufficiency, he has decided to make his craft his new profession and has formally enrolled in barber college with a goal to become self-employed.


Machine Band, incredible live and silent auctions, a luxury raffle, and delectable cuisine provided by some of the area's finest restaurants.
