

Letter from the Executive Director

COMMITMENT leads to action. Just 25 years ago, a small group of concerned, caring and committed individuals recognized that there was no place for those in need or in crisis in our community to get help to address very basic needs. Frisco Family Services (FFS) exists today because this committed group of caring individuals made a decision to take action. Little did they know, that their care, concern and commitment would be contagious and impact lives by the thousands for years to come.



As a community, your **COMMITMENT** over the years has made it possible for FFS to serve our neighbors in need in meaningful ways that demonstrate care and support while helping families maintain their dignity as they navigate through difficult situations. In 1994, as a core service, we began distributing gently used clothing to our neighbors in crisis. Today, as a result of your generosity and support, we not only make available, clothing, furniture and other items to families at no cost, but provide a continuum of programs and services to meet the needs of families in our community.

As a result of your **COMMITMENT**, we expanded our Summer Lunch Program to five sites, increasing our ability to get food in the hands of more children who are typically eligible for free and reduced lunch when school is in. You made it possible for us to provide more than 22,000 meals this summer.

Your **COMMITMENT** has been instrumental in helping us expand our support to seniors in our community. Adding programming that provides socialization, recreational activity and other supports, helps to combat the isolation that older adults feel as they age. You are helping seniors in our community thrive!

As a result of the support of generous friends like you, we have been able to support families in our community for 25 years! We still have much work to do. I am super excited to share that in an effort to build the capacity necessary to meet the needs of our growing community, this fall we will break ground on a new Client Services Building. Committed to **PREVENTING HUNGER** in our Community

Frisco Family Services Food Pantry is client choice, where clients shop in a grocery store-like setting for the food they know their families will eat, enabling them to avoid hunger while using their limited financial resources for other essential needs. To ensure seniors, those with health issues and other homebound clients have access to the same nutritious food in our food pantry, a mobile food pantry delivers groceries directly to clients. In addition to nutritious food – including meat, dairy, and fresh produce – hygiene and household products are also available.

This past year, YOUR support provided **541,525 meals** to our neighbors in crisis through Frisco's only community Food Pantry.



Summer Lunch Program - provides lunch daily and weekend meals throughout the summer to local children typically eligible for free and reduced lunch during the school year, and operates from five sites. Children also enjoy participating in recreational activities and meeting new friends.





Thanksgiving Meal Program -

provides individuals and families with a turkey and everything needed to prepare breakfast and a traditional Thanksgiving meal in the comfort of their own home. Families also receive a game or movie they can enjoy together.



Committed to helping families in crisis, like Laura's

I'm a single mom to the brightest and most brilliant 6-year-old daughter. I love music and get pleasure from working at her school teaching piano lessons. This past year, I discovered I had lupus. Learning my limits, and adjusting to a new normal, has not been easy. In the beginning, not being able to work as much, combined with many doctor appointments and purchasing of expensive medications, financially crippled us.

Asking for help was not easy. We have never been a lavish family, but we've never had to go without a whole lot either. We go on a mission trip every year and are used to being the ones helping others. It took everything I had not to let my daughter see that I was stressed, or that there was not very much food in the fridge. School was starting back up, and I knew that unlike every other year, I couldn't provide my daughter with the supplies she needed. Thankfully a resource like Frisco Family Services exists to help my family, and others like us, get through such hard times.

Frisco Family Services helped us adjust to our new normal. They provided us with groceries and help paying rent and utilities, while programs like the Back2School Fun Fair provided my daughter with all the school supplies she needed, new shoes and clothes, and more. She was over the moon just to have a new backpack, and that was one more thing I could check off my list. We're on our way to getting back on our feet, and looking forward to getting back to helping others.

Committed to creating **OPPORTUNITY** & providing **STABILITY** in our Community

Emergency Financial Assistance helps families stay in their homes, keep utilities connected, purchase prescription medication, offset childcare expenses, and provide for other critical needs. Payments are made to utility providers, landlords and other entities on behalf of clients.

CHAMPS (CHALLENGING ADULT MINDS FOR PERSONAL SUCCESS) workshops are facilitated by local businesses and professional volunteers in the community who provide each client with the education, tools, training, skills and support necessary to regain self-sufficiency.

Intensive Self-Sufficiency Program (ISSP) provides critical support to clients who have limited education and employment experience. Through one-on-one intensive case management, an individualized plan of action is developed that allows the client to remove barriers and obtain their financial independence once again.





Back2School Fun Fair - provides a new backpack filled with grade-appropriate school supplies, new clothing and shoes, hygiene items, haircuts, vision screenings, eyeglasses, and helpful community resources, to eligible parents and students, grades K-12, ensuring they are ready for a new school year.

Holiday Store Program - ensures individuals and families can have a joyous holiday season during their time of crisis. Generous donors provide toys, shoes, gift cards, new clothes and household items for eligible clients to select at our "no-cost" holiday store.
