For the last 25 years, Frisco Family Services has been committed to helping members of the Frisco and Frisco ISD community, who are facing hunger, homelessness and other urgent needs, improve their quality of life and achieve self-sufficiency. More than 3,700 individuals were provided assistance this past year, of which more than 50% are children and seniors. A life-changing crisis, such as serious illness or injury, job loss, death or divorce, can happen to anyone at any time and often results in destabilizing a family.
